Council Bus Subsidies

Earlier in the year the County Council announced that they were going to remove bus subsidies. Without a subsidy our bus would cease so we would have no service at all. The Council then decided they should have consulted before making a decision so there is now an opportunity for you to have your say about whether we need a bus service and whether it should be subsidised. All responses must be in by 16:00 on Friday 9th December.

Electricity Discount

This is just to make you aware of a scheme whereby any resident in an area which has no gas provision may have a rebate on electricity costs, as they are unable to access dual fuel discounts. This is not an automatic reduction, and must be applied for individually through the normal supplier.

You will need to access your supplier online and follow the link marked 'account', where details should be available. It would appear that this is possible on direct debit arrangements, and providing other discounts are not received. This is not widely publicised, but we hope that you are able to take advantage of it.

News from our PCSO John Coppard

We will be holding mobile surgeries in surrounding villages. This is known as our Get Closer Campaign. The first of these will be held in the Mobile Police Station, on

Wednesday 9th November, 09.00 - 10.00, Village Hall Car Park, Horningsea.

We look forward to seeing you. Please feel free to pop along and meet your local officers and discuss any issues or concerns you may have.

The 'Get Closer' campaign aims to increase the visibility of policing activity and raise the public's level of understanding of the breadth and depth of policing across Cambridgeshire in 2011/12 and beyond

- Cambridgeshire Constabulary is visible and active in your local area
- A reduced budget will not negatively impact on police performance in Cambridgeshire
- We will minimise the impact on performance of budget reductions by working in collaboration with Hertfordshire and Bedfordshire constabularies and with other local partners
- Cambridgeshire Constabulary is proactively, relentlessly and successfully targeting those who commit crime in Cambridgeshire
- There is more to police than patrolling. Visible and invisible force resources work together to keep Cambridgeshire safe
- Cambridgeshire Constabulary will continue to aim to transfer the fear of crime from the public to offenders
- The support and involvement of local communities is essential to fighting crime in Cambridgeshire and is recognised and appreciated by the force
- There are simple steps the public can take to protect themselves and their property from crime
- Cambridgeshire Constabulary is changing the way it delivers communications campaigns to make them more efficient and effective.

The force's crime figures for 2010/11 show that crime is down by more than five per cent and detections have increased. The Get Closer campaign will run for at least the next two years.

South Cambridgeshire District Council House Condition Survey

South Cambs is undertaking a Housing Stock Condition Survey across the whole district. This means there will be a number of surveyor/officers knocking on doors over the next 10 weeks. Each surveyor is working for David Adamson & Partners on the Council's behalf. They will be carrying ID from David Adamson. The surveyors will be working Mondays to Saturdays (including evenings) each week.

Please remember to ask anybody who claims to be from an agency who knocks on your door for identification, always check it carefully and if you're still not happy ask them to remain on the doorstep (closing your front door) whilst you go and check over the phone for confirmation of the representative. If they are genuine they will be more than happy to wait whilst you check.
