#### County Council Consultation on Slip Road at B047/A14 Junction

Cambridgeshire County Council is evaluating plans for the installation of controlled crossings of the exit and entry slip roads to the A14 from the B1047 Horningsea Road. Such crossings would be intended to help cyclists and pedestrians cross these roads in greater safety. The consultation is particularly important to Horningsea residents who commute by bicycle to work in Cambridge, and to those whose children might walk or cycle to school in Fen Ditton or Bottisham.

Please attend the public consultation! This is a great opportunity to learn about what is planned, and to have your views heard. County Council officers will be available to show the plans, answer questions and record your views at:

\* Horningsea Village Hall, 17:00-20:00 on **Wednesday 11 July**, or

\* Fen Ditton Church Hall, from 16:00-19:00, on Thursday 19 July.

For residents of Horningsea who cannot make the meeting on Wednesday 11th and instead wish to attend the meeting in Fen Ditton on 19th July, please note that Fen Ditton will be opening the Recreation Ground for the Town Bumps parking, as they try to prevent congestion in Church Street. If you would like to park on the Rec., you will not be charged.

#### Cycle-Pedestrian Path in the Village

A number of our neighbours have reported nearly being knocked over by cyclists on the pavement, near and in front of the Plough & Fleece. Cyclists, please... when you come off the dual-use cycle/footpath (the end of which is marked by red studs in the tarmac and an 'End' sign) as you enter Horningsea village: after having checked the main road for motor-vehicle traffic, do join the road carriageway as soon as it is safe to do so.

When you are cycling on the dual-use path, please be considerate of pedestrians, and be aware that they may not be able to hear you approaching. And if you do cycle on a footpath, be aware that pedestrians have a right to be there, and you don't.
