Waterbeach Barracks Development Updates

News about the Waterbeach Barracks development with a Horningsea focus.

Meeting with Urban & Civic - developers for Waterbeach Barracks

The meeting on 22nd February attracted about fifty people and produced some searching questions. The members of Urban & Civic gave a presentation on the company structure, their relationship with the MoD, the proposed outline planning application, the traffic scheme and timelines. They then took questions from residents which were mainly on how the expected increase in traffic on the B1047 could be mitigated. The planning application is large and complex and includes 6,500 dwellings, business, retail, community, leisure and sports uses; a hotel; new primary and secondary schools; green open spaces principal new accesses from the A10 and other points of access; associated infrastructure, groundworks and demolition. It will then be 18 months to 2 years before the full application is submitted. The development, to be accomplished over twenty years, will eventually be for a total of 10,000 dwellings. SCDC will view this development in the larger context of the Local Plan and Greater Cambridgeshire City Deal. The Waterbeach section of the Local Plan is due for examination in March. Residents expressed considerable concern about the impact of

increased traffic on the village and traffic and transport is one of the main concerns also raised by Waterbeach, Landbeach and Milton. A transport survey has been conducted and subsequent modelling carried out to ensure feasibility of the extra traffic load from the new development. The modelling takes into account other committed developments e.g. Marshals, North Cambridge etc. It will incorporate the final outcome and strategic improvements for the A10 once they are announced in July 2017. Current solutions focus on trying to offer attractive alternatives to driving from the start so that behaviours can be changed early. Interventions include pedestrian improvements along the A10, temporary park and ride on the Waterbeach development, bus service through the development to the Science Park, Waterbeach Station, Cambridge North, better cycle parking at Waterbeach station, more trains from Cambridge North station, reducing single occupancy cars. The transport strategy is a 'monitor and manage adaptive approach'.

Residents recognised the opportunities the facilities, such as shops, open spaces, leisure and sport, nurseries and health care could offer. They were also concerned that there should be sufficient affordable housing to support key workers such as teachers, and social rented housing for essential workers such as council staff.

More meetings are planned with Urban & Civic and with our district councillor and the PC expects to consider the Outline Planning Application at the next PC meeting on Wednesday 29th March to which all residents are invited.

Unfortunately the majority of the presentation in that meeting, did not address the topic of Horningsea. Even though we may see considerable negative aspects that may not be matched by benefits.

The rules of parish councils means Horningsea PC has a strict remit as to how they can use residents feedback. For example providing specific objections to planning

applications (see their report elsewhere in this newsletter). However, there are many areas, outside of planning, in which we could benefit from this development.

The group will strive to ensure that if the development goes ahead, there are positive developments to benefit Horningsea to offset the inevitable negative aspects.

The main aims will be:

- Gather feedback from residents.
- Produce a list of specific items that will mitigate negative aspects.
- Produce a list of positive benefits to the village that might be possible.
- Be a public advocate for the village to achieve the items on these lists.

Coprolite March 2017

Ye Jackdaw Chatter, Spring 1867

Unrest at ye Coprolite Diggings on Quy Fen.

Ye Coprolite diggers from ye olde Parishes of Quy, Fen Ditton & Horningsea, are so unhappy at the working conditions imposed on them by ye governors of the diggings that on May 2nd they held a march from Horningsea down to Quy Fen to protest to the governors.

On hearing word of this unrest the governors arranged for ye local constabulary to be present.

At about 9:00am nearly 200 men women and children assembled in Horningsea, the men carrying shovels. The march was preceded by a flag and a flute.

The contractor had, the previous day, made a reservoir for the washing of the coprolites, and levelled ground for about 1/4 of a mile. The demonstrators cut grips across making it completely unfit for use. The policeman reported that *"The whole of those assembled were very peaceful and civil in all they said and did towards the police."*



Many of you who keep all your back copies of our Village Magazine will recognise the above as an excerpt from the Spring issue of Jackdaw Chatter 1876. The current inhabitants of Horningsea wish to re-enact this famous March 150 years later, and have asked people from the surrounding villages, if they will join them (As they did in 1876) . If you have sympathy for their cause , or if you just want to go along please

assemble in Horningsea High Street on Sunday 21st May at 11:30. They are hoping for 200 people as on the original march.

This time when the marchers reach Quy Fen there will be a communal picnic, so please take along suitable eats and drinks. There are many rare and beautiful plants in Quy Fen, which is why it has been allocated as an S.S.S.I. May would be a good time to see these flowers at their best. It is hoped to find an expert botanist to come along and talk about all the rare plants you will see.

In addition to the above Quy Fen has been chosen by the Freshwater Habitats Trust of Great Britain to be one of only 11 sites in Gt Britain to be included in a vast study of flora and fauna. The trust have many experts in their field but welcome the help of local people in their studies. Already Bottisham Village College have decided to send a group of students. An invitation to Horningsea from Fen Ditton 800

We would like to invite our neighbours in Horningsea to join us in celebrating Fen Ditton's 800th anniversary this year. There will be events throughout the year, including the following, but more to be arranged

In the evening, from 19:00, Fen Dragon band will be playing at the Ceilidh (ticketed) which will have a BBQ and ale tent.

Notes

A14 Widening Scheme Section 4 & 5 - Swavesey to Milton during March

Further overnight closures on the A14 will allow them to finalise the installation of both CCTV and speed cameras in preparation for the implementation of narrow lanes on both carriageways in the area between Dry Dayton and Swavesey. For safety reasons this work has had to be carried out at night under a full carriageway closure of the A14. Once the narrow lanes are installed they will be able to safely undertake works in the verges of both carriageways of the A14

The traffic management on the A428 will allow them to begin works in that area for the construction of a new bridge which will form part of the new free flow link for traffic travelling westwards from Histon. This link will remove the need to negotiate the current cloverleaf interchange and will connect directly onto the new improved A14 westbound carriageway prior to Cambridge Crematorium.

Work will begin this month on the construction of the new local access road that will run from Huntingdon Road, Cambridge and sweep south of the crematorium before it crosses over to the north side of the A14 at Dry Drayton, where it continues to Huntingdon.

A ramp to St Peter's Church Horningsea

It all sounded so easy – we have a disabled loo and we have completed the work inside the church. All that is left is to build the ramp for access by wheelchairs and pushchairs. However nothing is as straightforward as you think! We have to take down some of the trees in order to have a long enough “sweep” for the ramps. We have had surveyors digging holes to look at the foundations of the church, the council tree officer to advise, architects have produced number of different drawings. The ramp has to be strong enough to hold wedding and funeral cars, scaffolding lorries and lorries with skips. It has to blend in with the Grade I listed church. The surface has to be appropriate for wheelchair users and buggies not to get stuck in the gravel. We asked for comments from the village and Parish Council some months ago and had some useful comments. The PCC has agreed to apply to the Diocese for a Faculty (church equivalent of planning permission) and a notice will be put in the church notice board asking for any formal comments on the final plan. The PCC is also keen to ensure that any trees planted to replace the cypresses are wildlife friendly and propose to consult an organisation called “Gods Acre” which advises on wildlife in churchyards. If you have any questions or comments about the plan please speak to Andy Clarke.
