The church wardens are proud that, even though we are the smallest of the three parishes, we are the most organised with the most support from the village!

If there has been a lot of rain, parts of the field may be a bit muddy! Anyone with mobility problems can be dropped at the door of the church but please do not leave your car on the church path. We will reserve seats for anyone with a disability – please contact one of the church wardens. Choir, Clergy and Lay Ministers will robe at Richard and Tessa's home at St John's Barn – across St John's Lane from the Church. Thank you to them and to Michael and Sally whose home will be used for the Bishop,

Archdeacon, Alun & Carol and other key players to robe. Thanks to John and Liz for allowing us to use their field.

The 150th Anniversary of the Coprolite Workers March from Horningsea to Quy Fen

Saturday 20th May at 18.30 at St Peter’s Church

Bernard O’Connor, the expert on the Coprolite Industry in Cambridgeshire will be giving an illustrated talk to get us all in the mood for the march, answer our questions and tell us why the Coprolite Industry had such a major impact on the villages of Horningsea, Fen Ditton and Quy. He will be able to tell us what coprolite is (possibly not fossilised dinosaur dung as we all believe!) and what it was used for.

We have arranged this talk for the early evening so that families can come – after all children know more about dinosaurs than adults! In addition to the talk there will be some music – maybe the *Song of the Coprolite worker* (by Dave Jenkins - one of his Coprolite Songs!), Irish tunes as some of the workers came here from across the Irish sea and music from the Fens.



There will be no charge for the evening but donations will be collected.

Sunday 21st May at 11.30

The group will gather at the Jubilee Gardens in the centre of Horningsea to set off on the march – behind a “flag and a flute”. Can we match the 200 men, women and children who took part 150 years ago? The walk to Quy Fen is about a mile or so – depending on which footpath you follow. The footpaths will be muddy and uneven so wear sensible shoes. Bring a picnic to eat when we arrive at the “cut”. Dogs need to be kept under control and at Quy Fen they must be on leads as there will be cattle grazing on part of the fen - we all know how cattle can get spooked by lively dogs and have been known to trample dogs or people – so take care! On the march parents must be responsible for their own children – we will have stewards directing the marchers across the road – outside Old Tiles – but we still have a short walk on the road itself before going through the hedge onto the footpath. At Quy Fen we must all obey the rules of this Special Scientific area – so read the signs. I am always amused by the one that says “nudism may offend



and is forbidden!" and note that, how ever hot it is, swimming in "the cut" is dangerous because of the depth of mud and the vegetation. At the Fen there may be a botanist or ecologist who can talk to us about some of the rare species to be found – orchids and dragonflies in particular. Let's hope for fine weather and that a good day will be had by all! If anyone wants to come but can't walk that far arrangements will be made to provide transport by car. Please let Lindsay know if you need transport.

Horningsea Cycle Ride to the Queens Head, Newton, 'Over the Gogs and far away'

St George's day must have been the perfect weather for a cycle ride; sunny, very little wind, just warm enough to make it feel good and not a dragon in sight!

Eleven of us started from our usual haunt, The Crown and Punchbowl, and made our way via the cycle path through Fen Ditton and on to the Jubilee Cycle Way passing through Teversham and Fulbourn before heading south to the Roman Road (Ermine Street) and the Mile Road – a glorious green road rolling downhill from the top of the Gogs to just short of the Babraham Institute.

There, we took advantage of the new cycle path that took us through the institute's grounds, the village itself and on to Sawston where we crossed the main road and took the Sawston to Whittlesford Cycle Way. We made a sandwich stop here alongside a very clear flowing River Granta (with a very brief sighting of a swimming grass snake) and enjoyed the warmth of the day before moving on via Whittlesford Church and a footpath that led us past the Bees In The Wall and a quiet country road to Newton.

The Queen's Head (our outward objective) welcomed us with some excellent ales, Ploughman's lunch and coffee. After refuelling, we set off on one of Frank's now famous "little diversions" which took us via farm tracks, round the back of the village and eventually over the M11 before depositing us on to the road just outside Little Shelford.



On through Great Shelford and over the level crossing, we picked up the DNA path that took us back towards Addenbrookes. Here, we were able to join the Guided Busway (yes, we were on the cyclepath!) and rode on to Cambridge Station. The contrast between the tranquility of our journey and the frenetic activity of Cambridge Station, with its cafés, shops, taxis, etc., was really mind-blowing.

Still, within minutes we had left all that behind and, crossing the pedestrian/cycle bridge, wove our way through the back streets to Mill Road and Coldhams Common; on past the football ground, then home via Ditton Meadows and Fen Ditton. Finally we found our own cycle path back to Horningsea and the Crown and Punchbowl. Here we received our usual warm welcome and made short work of a couple of Milton Brewery's best!

For those who like to know such things, we cycled just over 29 miles (46.7 Km) and climbed a total of 556ft (169m).

We are planning a couple more rides at the moment one of which will be a shorter family ride suitable for children and we look forward to seeing as many of you as possible there.

Fen Ditton 800 calls for votes to bag some funds

Fen Ditton 800 is bidding to bag a massive cash boost from the Tesco Bags of Help initiative. Vote for us at Haverhill Tesco. Tesco teamed up with Groundwork to launch its community funding scheme, which sees grants of £4,000, £2,000 and £1,000 – all raised from the 5p bag levy – being awarded to local community projects. Three groups in every Tesco region have been shortlisted to receive the cash award and shoppers are being invited to vote for who they think should take away the top grant. Fen Ditton 800 is one of the groups on the shortlist.

Fen Ditton 800 is the group organising the celebrations of the 800th anniversary of a church at Fen Ditton and hence a settlement (see note on p5 above).

So please vote! Voting is open in stores throughout May and June. Customers will cast their vote using a token given to them at the checkout in store each time they shop.

Fen Ditton Cricket Club

Fen Ditton Cricket Club is one of the small number of cricket clubs in Cambridgeshire that is actually growing. Last year we started a 2nd XI for the first time in the club's history and had a good first season with the 2nds finishing comfortably in mid table of their division of the Cambridgeshire Cricket Association Junior League whilst the 1st XI had their highest ever finish - 3rd in League 1 North, just missing out on promotion to the Senior Leagues. Over the last few years we have been developing a junior section and this season we expect to have teams playing at Under 13 and Under 11 levels throughout the summer. We are also encouraging our older youngsters, some of whom are playing regularly in our 2nd XI, with the chance to play in a number of midweek development fixtures. We have invested in new training facilities and have purchased a batting cage which will be in use on Wednesday evenings on our new practice strip on Fen Ditton Recreation Ground from 19th April.
