## **Flags**

You might have noticed that occasionally there is a Union Flag flying on the on the Village flagpole and perhaps wondered why this was done.

There are certain days in the year when if you have a flagpole it is courteous to fly a flag and these days are called "Red Letter Days". Indeed if you hold a Royal Warrant then you have the obligations firstly to have a flagpole and secondly to fly the Union Flag on Red Letter days.

These Red Letter days are almost all related to the Queen as they are on her Accession day and also on the birthdays of members of the Royal Family as well as Trafalgar Day and Remembrance Sunday.

June was a "busy" month as the 2<sup>nd</sup> was Coronation Day, the 11<sup>th</sup> was both the Birthday of the Duke of Edinburgh and the Queen's Official Birthday 11<sup>th</sup>, and the 21<sup>st</sup> the birthday of Prince William.

St George's Cross will also be flown on 17<sup>th</sup> April and on 25<sup>th</sup> October which is the "Feast of St Crispin /St Crispian" (which commemorates the Battle of Agincourt).
