Borrow an energy meter from any Cambridgeshire library free of charge and find out how you could cut your electricity bills by as much as 15%. The meters are easy and safe to use and show how much electricity is being used in your home at any one time. Using a meter can help you see just how much energy is used, for example, by lights in empty rooms, appliances on stand-by or boiling a full kettle. Armed with this information, studies show that households can reduce their bills by 5 -15% by making small changes to use less electricity. Ask to borrow a meter at your local library today and start planning what to do with your savings!

Green Tip: We all have an impact on the environment through our use of resources and burning fossil fuels for everyday activities such as driving cars and heating our homes. Harvest Festival at the Church

St Peter's Church Horningsea will be holding the annual Harvest Festival on **Sunday 9th October at 11am.** Please bring flowers, fruit or vegetables along to the Church at about 10am on Saturday 8th October - and join in the decoration of the Church. If you can't come on Saturday then bring your gifts to the service on Sunday. The Church always looks splendid with apples, marrows, tomatoes, grain, autumn flowers... During the Service we hope that children will join in with some readings and poems, paintings or drawings of what harvest means to them. After the service there will be refreshments and produce will be sold in aid of Farm Africa. We hope that the new Altar frontal, which has been funded by the Friends of Horningsea Church, will be dedicated during the service.

This will also be an opportunity to share ideas on how we can improve the Church. We want to make the Church warmer (!), to improve the toilet and kitchen facilities, and to improve access for people with mobility difficulties. Please bring along any ideas you have and we hope to have some ideas on display.

Horningsea Millennium Green Trust - Calling all Gardeners!

The Trust would like some help in making the green and orchard an attractive place. They are hoping to plant lots of daffodils on the bank at the edge of the Green. This has been formed with the topsoil taken from the improved parking area, and has already grassed over nicely. No date is fixed at the moment, but notices will be put up / stop press email sent.

For those who like something a bit more vigorous they will be doing some cutting and pruning **in the orchard on Saturday 5th November**, which will help add to the Village bonfire on the 6th. Bring saws (including chain saw if you have one), pruners and gloves with you.

Also, you will have noticed that the 'crab' apple trees have had a bumper crop in the orchard. You are welcome to pick some for your own use - there are eaters and cookers - and maybe juice some for the **Apple day on October 1st**. It would be nice to have some left to decorate the Church for the Harvest service the following weekend! There are also lots of sloes for those who like sloe gin!
