### St Peter's Church, Horningsea: Chancel Repairs i.e. the end of the Church with the Altar and Choir

Urgent repairs are needed inside and outside the Church to make it watertight. Work began on 9th January and will last for about 3 months during which the Chancel is out of action. The whole of the rest of the Church is covered in plastic sheets, and chaos reigns. The South Aisle has been turned into a small chapel – "cosy" might be the correct word if it was warmer! The work includes replacing the rotten floors under the choir stalls, removing the crumbling plaster to the walls, repairing the stonework inside and out, replastering, limewashing the walls ... at a cost of about £50,000. We have not been given an English Heritage grant so we are funding this from the Church's own resources – from a grant and loan from Historic Cambridge Churches Trust, from St John's College (we hope) and from a legacy. The Church funds will be completely depleted so we will start again to rebuild funds in order to raise enough money to fund the restoration of the floors in the North Aisle – maybe in 2013.

### Diamond Jubilee Celebrations at St Peter's Church

Following the HRA Street Party on Saturday 2nd June, on Sunday 3rd June there will be a service of celebration in St Peter's Church in the morning. On the Sunday and Monday 4th the Church will also host an exhibition of "60 Glorious Years in Horningsea" – with, among other things, weddings photographs, clothes, memorabilia of the last 60 years, and an exhibition of photographs by Trisha Smith of Horningsea houses built in the last 60 years – with some old photographs for comparison. Dinah Asplin will organise a School Reunion. Help is needed to do some research for the exhibition, so if you are interested in local history or have photographs or memorabilia to display, and if would like to get involved please contact Lindsay on 862 588.

On Monday 4th June there will be a concert of music from the last 60 years – organised by Tony Phillips... so get in touch with him if you have any ideas or would like to be involved in the concert.
