Star Songs

On Saturday July 6th, 19:30 the New Cambridge Singers will be performing a concert in St Peter's Church, Horningsea. This will be a special concert in that the Director, Chris Brown, is retiring after a lifetime of professional music making, and after 16 years with the New Cambridge Singers, this will be his final concert with the choir. As a boy treble, Chris sang at the coronation of Elizabeth II and, after reading music at Cambridge, has gone on to become a successful composer, conductor and teacher.

As well as music from C16th to C20th, the programme includes 'Star Songs', a piece specially commissioned by the NCS from Chris which he has set for choir and cello. It sets the legend of two young lovers in a small village in France who, like Romeo and Juliet, died for their love. A huge star is now suspended across the valley there as a symbol of this love. The concert concludes with Johann Sebastian Bach's glorious motet 'Singet dem Herrn ein neues Lied' (Sing to the Lord a new song) when the choir will be joined by some past members.

The cellist will be Graham Walker who succeeds Chris as Musical Director in September, and the choir will include three singers from Horningsea.

Tickets are £7, or £3 for under 16s, and can be bought on the door, or reserved in advance, by phoning Frank Hopkirk on 01223 861161.

Horningsea Horticultural Show

This year's show will be held on Saturday 13th July in the Village Hall. Entrants can show fruit and vegetables, flower arrangements, handicrafts and home baking/preserving. There are also children's categories for all ages up to eighteen. Friends and relatives can also join in, look out for the special categories in the schedule. The flower arrangement theme this year is "Pride and Prejudice" to mark the 200th Anniversary of this book's publication. The theme for the photograph is "Skies". There are many cups and trophies to be won and the afternoon finishes with an auction of donated produce and a raffle.

Schedules were delivered to all houses in the village in late May/early June. It can also be accessed on the village website. Entry forms need to be in by 19:30 on 10th July. Exhibits can be staged between 8:30 and 10:30 on 13th July and the doors open for viewing at 14:30.

The Horningsea Flag Pole has been re-furbished and was re-erected for the Village day on 8th June where it displayed various flags. The Union Flag should have been flown on 2nd June (Coronation Day) and was flown on 10th June (Duke of Edinburgh's Birthday).

It was also flown on 12th June (The Queen's Official Birthday) and 21st June (Prince William's Birthday) and the next date is 7th July (Duchess of Cornwall's Birthday). These dates are known as "Red Letter" days and if you have a flag pole the Union Flag should be flown as a matter of courtesy.

On 29th June St Peter's Crossed keys was flown to celebrate St Petertide and then was taken on 30th June to the St Petertide 11:00 service in the church.
