Commemoration of the outbreak of WWI: report.

A very moving service was held at the Horningsea War Memorial on the 3rd of August. John Wilson spoke of the 63 people from Horningsea who went to War including one woman. He recalled those who survived and lived with the aftermath including the wheezy street cleaner who never recovered from the effects of being gassed. The service finished with everyone taking sprigs of rosemary for remembrance, placing some around the memorial and taking others home.

After the service the mood changed as the Plough and Fleece hosted the WWI poems and pints. Contributions included excerpts from Testament of Youth, Houseman, Wilfred Owen, A A Milne, an Anzac poem, a poem by a French war poet, a spoof German nursery rhyme... ...and in between we packed up our troubles in our old kit bags, made our long way to Tipperary and enjoyed the "Oh What a lovely war" speeches and songs.

We provide you with the funding to get you started and all the necessary support to the club to enable you to participate in a new sport of your choice.

Eligibility: Anyone with a long term health need or disability aged 14 +. No upper age limit

Get Closer campaign urges victims to report sexual assault and rape.

Throughout September the force's Get Closer campaign will focus on encouraging victims who have experienced sexual assault or rape, to come forward and report it. The initiative aims to raise awareness that women, men, teenagers and children can all be victims and assaults can be committed by strangers, family members or friends. The key message to offenders is "if they say no, they mean no".

Sexual assaults often go unreported because people are scared to talk to someone, feel as if they won't be listened to, or just don't know who contact.

The force will be working with the Oasis @ Rivergate, Sexual Assault Referral Centre (SARC) and a number of partner agencies including Rape Crisis, Victim Support and the Samaritans in order to provide counselling, medical examinations and treatment for victims. Detective Chief Inspector Karryann Beeby, from the force's Public Protection Department, said: "We understand just how difficult it is for victims to come forward and report sexual assault and rape. This type of crime can change your life and we want to make sure those people affected know where they can come to get advice and support. I want to reassure victims that we investigate each and every case to ensure justice is done. I would also like to thank our partner members, for their support. We are undertaking a number of preventative messages to warn those who do commit such crimes that they will be punished and it may result in a prison sentence."

To report a crime, there are three options:

- If the incident has just taken place dial 999
- · Or call 101 and we will arrange for a police officer to come to see you

Victims may not want the police to be involved and whilst we would encourage people to report assaults, you can self-refer to the Oasis @ Rivergate by calling 0845 089 6262.
