Solos will be sung by members of the choir. The audience will be invited to join in the singing of the Hallelujah chorus to end the concert and there will be a carol to join in singing before the interval..

The first half of the concert will include American composer Morten Lauridsen's setting of O Magnum Mysterium, which has become a 20th choral classic, and Archangelo Corelli's Christmas Concerto played by the ensemble.

Come and enjoy this glorious music in the candlelit ambience of St Peter's, as the Horningsea 800 year draws to a close.
