Horningsea Horticultural Show

Saturday 11th July in the Village Hall

The Show will be held on Saturday 11th July in the Village Hall. The flower arrangement theme this year is "Alice in Wonderland" and the theme for the photos is "A garden".

This year we have introduced a new trophy for the "Peoples choice of Best in Show". Visitors to the show in the afternoon will be asked to vote for their favourite exhibit in the adult classes and the winner will be awarded the trophy at the prize giving.

Entry forms need to be delivered to Vee Saunders by Wednesday 8th July at the latest. Exhibits

should be taken to the village hall between 8am and 10.30 on Saturday morning and viewing in the afternoon starts at 14.30. As usual donated produce will be auctioned and there will be a raffle after the prize giving.

If you won a trophy last year please don't forget to return it prior to the show to a member of the committee (names and addresses are on the schedule), or to the village hall on Saturday morning.

Open Studios in St Peter's Church Horningsea on Saturday 11 July and Sunday 12 July 11:00 - 18:00 each day and on Saturday 18th and Sunday 19th July 11 - 18:00 each day. The six artists in Studio CB25 who are exhibiting meet regularly in the village, and their work on display will include a range of styles and media. In addition and in support of the Open Studio events on Saturday 18 July there will be a concert in the evening of songs, instrumental music and words. The music will include trio



sonatas from the baroque period played on recorder, flute and cello, whilst the readings will be on the theme of the 015 anniversaries - Magna Carta , Agincourt, Waterloo, Rupert Brook, Carol Anne Duffy (the readings will be light hearted and may include excerpts from 1066 and all that, love letters between Napoleon & Josephine). On Sunday 19 July at 10:00 there will be a special church service "In praise of Art" at which the preacher will be Canon Ben Quash who is Professor of Art & Christianity at Kings College London and well known for the series of talks he has done in connection with the National Gallery.

There will be refreshments available in the church for most of both weekends. Come and support your local artists!

Time to tackle speeding cars in Horningsea

- The only effective way, we've been told by the Police, is to have a Community Speedwatch
- It's relatively easy, requires just 3 volunteers for a session and is proven to have results
- A session might be less than an hour
- Training takes a short time, we are helped by the County Police Speedwatch coordinator and he supervises our first session
- There is no speed gun pointing, drivers are not charged, the emphasis is on education
- The village is not going to get traffic-calming measures and, we gather, that the flashing speed signs will be removed universally in the future

Never forget when to put the bins out!

The app was developed by Richard Jones from Waterbeach. It's free and it has Horningsea black, blue and green bin collection dates in there and you can opt for it to give you an alert at a suitable juncture so that you don't miss the bins. And it knows all about Bank Holidays too.

There is a small and discrete advertising strip at the bottom of the page but that is unintrusive and if you've opened it once and accepted the notifications, then you never have to open the app again. I installed it and then forgot I had done so, and then on Monday night at 18:58 it faithfully told me that I should put the black bin out.
