Residents are very welcome at PC meetings which are held at 19.30 in the village hall on the last Wednesday, bi-monthly. The next Ordinary meeting is 27th July.

At the elections on 5th May, the following councillors were returned unapposed: Michael Gingell, Andy Greed, Jessica Kitt, Andy Nealey, Tessa Pleasants and Margaret Starkie.

At the Ordinary meeting on 25th May, Robert Balm was co-opted onto the council. Members expressed their thanks and good wishes to Richard McMahon who stood down at the election having served for many years on the council and more recently as Chairman.

Our Parish Clerk, Hayley Livermore, was re-appointed as Responsible Financial Officer.

Following the recent Internal Audit, the Statement of Governance was adopted and the end of year accounts were approved. Happy 100th Birthday to Margaret Dorrington from Horningsea Church.

Margaret and Sid moved to Horningsea in the 1970's as they wanted a house on the river so they could keep their boat. Margaret was horrified to find that the church was in a terrible state, the churchyard was overgrown and brambles grew through the windows. The church was in danger of being declared redundant but Margaret and Molly Marshall were determined this should not happen. They set about working to restore the church. They visited the Bishop, they raised money by picking snowdrops in the Old Vicarage and selling them, then picked cherry plums and sold them. They researched the history of the church and shared their knowledge with numerous visitors. Margaret was a very keen photographer so she photographed every part of the church. She translated medieval Latin descriptions of the church. She learned how to "dowse" in order to work out the location of the Saxon foundations. She went to church every Sunday, forcing Rev Paul Smythe to hold services when he did not want to. For 40 years she has devoted her life to Horningsea Church and we all have enormous reason to be grateful to her when we look at the Church today. For her 90th birthday we planted a magnolia tree and a hedge between the church and the Crown & Punchbowl. For her 100th Birthday we plan to plant a rose in the churchyard. Happy Birthday Margaret!

Speedwatch

The SpeedWatch equipment came back to Horningsea last Friday, so the volunteers will be out in groups of three over the next few weeks.

SpeedWatch is an association between Cambridgeshire Constabulary and local residents. We're all trained by Brian Robins, the police officer in charge of SpeedWatch, and he lends us the equipment.

The equipment is not a 'speedgun'; it's a large display which can be seen by all the volunteers and by the motorists. It displays the speed of the vehicle at which its radar is 'looking'. The volunteers then write down the speed indicated, the registration mark of the vehicle and its make and colour. We do not prosecute, or comment; we simply record.

The data (which is confidential) is sent, by e-mail, to a police computer which sends out friendly letters to the speeding motorists. If they are recorded a second time, the letter is a little less friendly. If they are recorded a third time, a police officer calls at their address.

SpeedWatch is educational; it teaches motorists to think about their speed and the consequences of speeding. It teaches them that if they speed through our village they will be noticed.

We'll have the equipment for a couple of weeks, and we are then asked to pass it to Fen Ditton for a few weeks. They, in turn will pass it to Waterbeach who will return it to us. We expect it to be available for about two weeks in every six.

If you'd like to help, come and talk to us at the roadside, or e-mail me at john.starkie@talk21.com and we can arrange for Brian to train you. Then you can spend happy hours, in the rain and wind and sun, writing down car numbers!

Horningsea Broadband Update

"Dear Horningsea Parish Council and Residents,

The last email update with regards to fibre broadband for Horningsea, dated 28th April, explained that Network Rail had agreed to the works submitted by BT and that we would let you know as soon as a date for the commencement of these works was set.

We have been informed by BT today that work is due to begin on 29th May.

Subject to the successful completion of these works, the cabinet can then go live as planned by 30th June."

Beaches Community Car Scheme serves the villages of Horningsea, Landbeach, Milton and Waterbeach. More volunteer drivers are urgently needed to deliver this service - with a limited bus service this is the only way some of our residents can get to the surgery or hospital.

Volunteers are paid a small mileage charge by the client and this is topped up by Cambridgeshire County Council once a month.

City Deal and Cambridge congestion
