Horningsea Horticultural Show

Saturday, 9th July, Village Hall

If you have never entered the Show before, now is the time to give it a go. The atmosphere is very friendly and there are many different classes to choose from. You don't have to be a gardener to enter!

The Show will be held on Saturday 9th July in the Village Hall. Schedules and entry forms will be delivered to every house in the village in early June, so there will be plenty of time to plan exhibits. The flower arrangement theme this year is "Midsummer Nights Dream" and the theme for the photos is "Sport".

Entry forms need to be delivered to Vee Saunders by Wednesday 6th July, late entries may be accepted, at the discretion of the committee, up until 21:00 on Friday 8th July. Exhibits can be staged in the Village Hall on Friday 8th July from 19:00-21:00 or from 8-10.30 on Saturday morning and viewing in the afternoon starts at 14.30. As usual donated produce will be auctioned and there will be a raffle after the prize giving.

If you won a trophy last year please don't forget to return it prior to the show to a member of the committee (names and addresses are on the schedule), or to the village hall on Saturday morning.

We had received a generous grant from the Parish Council to provide special attractions to celebrate the Queen's 90th birthday as part of our Village Day on June 11th and this included a ceilidh band to play from 18:30 onwards. Additionally, we had made a decision to spend some HRA funds on the purchase of a marquee which will be



an excellent long-term asset and proved its worth on its maiden outing. As it happened - against the odds - the afternoon was warm and stayed dry. We enjoyed a well-attended bring-and-share long-table picnic on the grass between the hall and the marquee and the



children (and later some adults) had fun on the bouncy slide. An informal cricket match ran all afternoon and there were some imaginative entries for the cake-baking and 'painting of the Queen' competition. Nicola produced a superb Queen Quiz and Lindsay presented prizes suitably dressed in her Royal Garden Party outfit.

We lit the barbecue and the band played in the new marquee. There was lots of hilarious dancing and we all had great fun - from tiny

children to seniors - and nobody got trampled or had a heart attack, although it was a close call on both counts. It was a fantastic day for which we owe much thanks to all of the HRA committee but in particular Graham Haynes for his organisation of the marquee and band. Although the 'hard core' partied on to the early hours, all the clearing up had been completed just before the heavens opened. There's a saying that 'it's better to be born lucky than clever'!

Horningsea Parish Council

All residents are welcome at meetings; the next Ordinary Meeting is on Wednesday 27th July. Extraordinary meetings are held when there are time constraints on items such as planning applications. The website also gives information on the PC's financial state, important notices from the district and county councils and, very importantly right now, the latest information on the availability of super fast broadband!



Cambridgeshire Highways held an Open Day on Monday 27th June at the Whittlesford Depot. Issues discussed with the officers included recent flash flooding, verge grass cutting, paths and speed restriction measures. I am grateful to Rob King for joining me in getting advice from Andy Preston, one of the Local Highway Improvement Initiative officers. The PC has applied twice in the last four years for partial funding of traffic calming measures at both north and south entrances to the village and a 50mph limit on Horningsea Road, but without success. The application process has recently changed and we were given advice on the types of measures available, data needed to support an application and how applications are assessed and scored. PC members will need to assess this information at the July meeting.

SCDC Community Chest - the PC has been successful in its bid for a grant of £1,500 from SCDC and will increase this to £3,500 as a grant to Horningsea Village Hall Trust towards the cost of audiovisual facilities.

"Dear Horningsea Parish Council and Residents,

We would like to let you know that works to bring fibre broadband to Horningsea are now complete and we are delighted to announce that today we have received confirmation from BT that the cabinet has now gone live.



Residents should now be able to upgrade to a fibre broadband service with their chosen Internet Service Provider (ISP). However, please be aware that it can take a week or so for all ISPs to register the live fibre service.

Please share this good news with your neighbours.

If you have any issues upgrading, please do not hesitate to contact us."

Beaches Community Car Scheme serves the villages of Horningsea, Landbeach, Milton and Waterbeach. More volunteer drivers are urgently needed to deliver this service - with a limited bus service this is the only way some of our residents can get to the surgery or hospital.

Volunteers are paid a small mileage charge by the client and this is topped up by Cambridgeshire County Council once a month.
