Horningsea Parish Council update

Thank you to all residents who attended the PC meeting on Wednesday 29th March and the various viewings of the Waterbeach Development plans. The Parish Council has listened to all the representations and will consider these when responding to SCDC.

Paul Mumford, the case officer for this application and his colleague Andrew Winter together with Dave Allatt from Cambs. County Council were at the meeting to answer questions on process and timings. They stressed that this is an Outline Planning Application and therefore an opportunity for residents to raise concerns about any aspect of the proposed development.

The primary concern of the council and of residents is the apparent lack of joined-up thinking, and integration of schemes, especially in relation to the increased pressure on the A10 and the likely effect on the B1047 and Horningsea. While this OPA is from the Secretary for State for Defence and Urban & Civic and is for 6,500 dwellings, schools, retail outlets, an hotel and landscaping, the area of land to the east is being developed by Turnstone for RLW Estates and plans for this area, taking the total number of dwellings to about 9,000, although 11,00 has been mooted, will not be available until the end of 2017.

CCC Highways is responsible for the A10 and has commissioned the A10 Corridor Transport Strategy which will conclude this summer. This will report on the current and future burden on the A10 from north of Ely to the A14 interchange effect on routes further into Cambridge. This planning application seems premature considering the A10 strategy and the infrastructure and connections between the western and eastern parts of the new town are unknown. However, we were told by Dave Allatt that the A10 Corridor Transport Strategy must be in place before the OPA can be determined early in 2018.

Other concerns raised were of the height and density of the buildings in a long-view, flat landscape, the use of agricultural land (35%) for urban building, the lack of feasible

cycle routes, building on fen land, flood risk and effect of construction traffic on listed buildings and conservation area.

The lack of cohesion and detail on funding any improvements to the A10 was also a concern. We were told that City Deal will provide much of the funding although there will be contributions from all developers along the A10, and Cambridge City, County and District will work together for an integration of plans.

The PC has drafted a response to the proposal; we have an extension to 10th May so it will be ratified at a special meeting before the APM on 3rd May. Residents have until 10th April to enter their comments; if any resident needs help with this please contact one of the councillors.

After the OPA has been determined a Supplementary Planning Document will be produced to allow a better understanding of the infrastructure, transport, foul water drainage, energy supply and the strategy for the organisation of the whole site. The PC will comment on this.

Coprolite Workers March

Sunday 21st May 2017

On Saturday 20th May Bernard O'Connor will come and give an illustrated talk about the Horningsea Coprolite workers. He is a "world expert" on the Cambridgeshire Coprolite industry and has written a number of books, including one on Coprolite workers in Horningsea and another on Fen Ditton. The evening will also include songs and music about the workers the Fens (and some Irish music for the workers who came here from across the Irish Sea!) Details in next month's HH. On Sunday 21st May we hope to get as many "men, women and children" (plus some dogs) to replicate the march to Quy Fen of 150 years ago when 200 walked behind a flute and a flag to complain about conditions. We will have a picnic when we get there. We will set off from the Jubilee Gardens and playground at 11.30am.

It's a huge honour to represent the diverse area of South East Cambridgeshire in Parliament. I am always delighted to attend local events and meetings whenever I am able to so please do keep me posted on anything upcoming.

I wanted to take the opportunity to make you aware of some of the areas I'm working on that I think may be of interest to you. I am actively working to progress a number of key infrastructure projects across the constituency including upgrading the A10, building the Ely bypass, improving the A14/A142 junction and building a station in Soham. I am delighted that building work on the Ely Bypass has started and want to pay credit to all those I have been working with and all those who came before us to make this happen. I am campaigning hard to improve broadband and mobile connections in the area and will be hosting a meeting with Matt Hancock, Minister for Digital and Culture in the region later this month. Campaigning for fairer funding for our schools has always been high on my agenda and I was pleased to enable a delegation of headteachers from our local secondary schools to put our case directly to the Secretary of State for Education, Justine Greening.

Staying safe in Cambridgeshire

Chief Inspector James Sutherland hosted a Safety meeting at SCDC offices in Cambourne on 18th March which was attended by more than 80 parish councillors from across Cambridgeshire. Workshops were held on SAFE (scams and fraud education), Fire safety and the multi-agency safeguarding hub (MASH), Neighbourhood Watch and Speedwatch. The aim of the meeting was to raise awareness of the issues and to try to prevent them.

We learned that people of all ages were subjected to scams involving telephone requests for money for charities or access to computers, bank accounts and personal identity. We heard of clairvoyants who preyed on recently bereaved, of offers of lottery wins, spiritual protection and investment schemes.

The fire service and MASH offer a Safe and Well visit for those who might be at risk and targets fire safety in the home, falls prevention, incidents arising from alcohol use, how to stay warm and well and crime reduction.

Neighbourhood Watch and Speed Watch coordinators both highlighted how prevention was better than cure and gave advice on setting up volunteer groups.

Horningsea Road repairs and closure

Cambridgeshire Highways and their supply chain partner, will commence carriageway patching and preparation works on Friday 7th April 2017, in advance of carriageway Surface Treatment later in 2017.
