As part of Heritage Open Days you'll be able to transport yourself from the medieval period to the Victorian all in one day. Fen Edge treasures St Peter's Church in Horningsea, the Landbeach Tithe Barn, All Saints' Church in Landbeach and St Mary the Virgin Church in Fen Ditton are all opening their doors for free for you to enjoy on Saturday 9th September.

Heritage Open Days is the largest heritage festival in the country; in 2015, over 4,800 events welcomed around three million visitors across England. Heritage Open Days operates as part of the National Trust with funding from players of People's Postcode Lottery. Reports

Horningsea Parish Council meeting 26th July

Horningsea Parish Council

Finance & governance - Members received the Internal Auditor's report for financial year 2016-2017 which showed a high level of compliance with regulations. Spending so far this year is in line with budget

Traffic control - Members also received an update on the mobile VAS to be installed under an LHI grant, the road markings and meetings with CCC Highways engineer. The council will monitor the effectiveness of the suggested locations and may ask for alternatives. The white lining on the west side of Horningsea Road is incomplete and we have been told that CCC has no resource as it is a C class road and the engineers do not consider it necessary as the road is straight and the pathway lit. Members discussed the possibility of funding it but this would commit the council to maintenance. It was decided to review at future meetings.

Waterbeach Development - The PC was not invited to the meeting in Waterbeach at which the Supplementary Planning Document was discussed. We have asked for a meeting with SCDC planners and the consultants ARUP who are writing the document; it is likely to be in September. We have heard that CCC Economy and Environment committee has objected to the Outline Planning Application on the grounds of Education, Flood and Water, Highway Safety and Ecology and have Holding Objections on Transport Assessment and Public Health. A10 Corridor study - The study is unlikely to conclude in full before the end of the year, however information will be emerging throughout the autumn and will be shared with parish councils with a briefing to County Councillors in September at which they will start discussing potential mitigation measures.

Temporary closure of Clayhithe Road level crossing - The road will be closed overnight on 20th August between 05:00 and 08:20 to enable "essential maintenance works which are being carried out on or near this highway and it will come into operation on 20 August 2017 and continue until these works have finished or on the 19 February 2018 whichever is the earlier".

Cambs. ACRE survey on Children's Services - CCC is proposing redesigning Children's Services. The consultation and survey can be found at Children's Centres consultation

Residents are always welcome at PC meetings and may speak briefly during the Open Forum.

State of Housing Stock in South Cambridgeshire

Following the tragic fire at Grenfell House in London, the Housing Portfolio Holder of SCDC reported about building cladding in South Cambridgeshire.

The Council has no tower blocks and its flatted blocks are no more than 3 storeys high. None of its flatted blocks are clad with rain screen systems

An ongoing programme to externally insulate poorest performing Council houses and bungalows has been in progress for the last 6 years and to date about 800 of the programmed properties have been upgraded in this way. Houses and bungalows offer different emergency evacuation options to those which applied at Grenfell Tower.

All external wall insulation installed by the Council conforms to British Standards and is approved by the British Board of Agreement [BBA].

The systems have fire resistance and are compliant with Building Regulation B4. The contractors installing the systems are PAS2030 accredited [Government standard]

In May 2017 a company called Safesmart Limited, specialists in fire risk assessment, was commissioned to carry out a full fire safety inspection of the Council's flatted blocks and sheltered housing communal rooms. The inspection commenced on 06 June 2017 and will conclude 20 July 2017. The Council will receive a full report for each block.

For peace of mind Officers carried out their own simple test on the insulation in isolation to see how it reacts to fire. They observed that the material just shrinks away due to its design and fire resistance properties. As soon as the heat source is removed it doesn't burn or accelerate in any way.

Is heat escaping from your house?

I have been wondering for some time now whether my house is energy efficient. Part of that is to understand if my house is well insulated. I would therefore like to know if any heat is escaping from my house. Interestingly, South Cambs District Council have a thermal camera which they will lend out for free. I intend to make use of this to image my house.

South Cambs advise to do this during the winter months. So I have a bit of time before I request the camera. If anybody else is interested in imaging their house, please let me know and we can share the use of the camera during the period that I am borrowing it. Which will be sometime between October and March.
