Student Cross Pilgrims visit Horningsea

Tuesday 27th March at about 10.30

Every year on the Tuesday in Holy Week the Student Cross Pilgrims walk through Horningsea on their way from London to Walsingham in Norfolk. They spend Monday night in Cambridge, walk along the towpath, cross the river at Baits Bite, walk up to the High Street and along to the Church. You can't miss them as they carry a large cross as they walk, and sometimes sing as they go along. In the church they tend to their blisters, dry out and have a cup of tea. Vee is in charge of refreshments but she needs a lot of helpers. Please let her know if you can come and help pour cups of tea. The Pilgrims then sing, have a blessing and set off again, walking to Quy Fen and Lode for their next stop. If you see them coming through the village you can walk with them, or at least give them a wave as they pass.

The meeting will provide the opportunity to explore all aspects of the planned incinerator and resolve ambiguities from the previous public meeting. Doctors,

Teachers, Scientists, Residents, MPs, District and Parish councillors, the Environment Agency, Amey, Public Health England and Council planning officers have been invited.

The aim is for the public and their elected representatives to be able to make a fully informed choice as to whether they want their rubbish to be burnt.

This meeting has been organised by CBWIN.co.uk a group formed by concerned Cambridge residents who wish to help you simply understand the complicated facts surrounding the proposed waste incinerator, and not just the information given by commercially interested parties. Horningsea Church needs a new Treasurer!

Andy Clarke has decided to hang up his calculator after nearly 20 years as Church Treasurer. He has guided the Church through substantial renovation and reordering works, obtaining grants, sorting out builders and liaising with architects. Somehow he has always kept the church solvent. Now the work has been done Andy would like to hand over the day to day accounts to someone else. This is not onerous, a monthly trip to the bank, payment of regular outgoings and preparation of financial reports to the church council 3 or 4 times a year. If you have any experience of accounts or bookkeeping and if you would be interested in taking on this task please speak to one of the Church Wardens or to Andy.

Parish Council Elections - call for nominations

The work of parish councillors is important, interesting but not arduous. Horningsea PC meets bi-monthly to make decisions on planning applications, finance, tree work and maintenance of village assets. Extraordinary meetings are sometimes held because of time constraints, especially for planning applications.

The election is being held at the same time as that for the District Council on 3rd May and the nomination papers are now available. They have to be completed and delivered to SCDC by 6th April.

Planning Application Boating Lake

Horningsea Parish Council

The PC has just received notice of a planning application for a boating lake extending from a canal from River Cam south of Baites Bite Lock north to the entrance on Car Dyke Road at Waterbeach. It will lie west of the railway line.

We will ask for an extension so that members can consider it at the ordinary PC meeting on 31st March but, if no extension is granted, the PC will consider it at an extraordinary meeting which will be advertised on the website and notice board.

Horningsea Adults & Toddlers - HATs

Horningsea adult and toddler group meets on a Tuesday morning in the village hall in Horningsea from 10-11:30.

We have Play-doh, a toy kitchen and food, toy farm animals, cars and garages, Duplo, puzzles, books and drawing materials as well as baby friendly toys along with support cushions for the really tiny ones. If the weather is nice the children have the opportunity to play outside with outdoor toys.

For adults there is a hot drink and biscuit and a chance for a chat whilst the little ones play.

A snack and drink is given to the children half way through the session which is included in the cost of the attendance. This cost is £2 per session, per family. However, if you pay for four sessions at once it's £6 (£1.50 per session).

Adults without children are also welcome if you fancy a hot drink and a chat (amongst the noise of the children playing), a £1 donation is asked for in this instance.

We look forward to welcoming you to the group!

There is plenty of parking available outside the village hall.
