#### Parish Council grants to local groups

The Parish Council must set its budget in January in order to request the Precept from SCDC. The council tries to keep the Precept low, as it comes out of residents' council tax, but we have to budget for grass and hedge cutting, maintenance and repairs, insurance and clerk's salary.

All spending is governed by Powers which are set down in law. One or more of these Powers allows PCs to give grants to local groups in proportion to the benefit that residents receive from their activities.

If your group is likely to apply for a grant in 2019 it would be very helpful if you can give some information to Hayley at clerk@horningsea.net by 14th January so that the council members can consider it when setting the budget.

### Horningsea Adults & Toddlers - HATs

Horningsea adult and toddler group meets on Tuesday morning in the village hall in Horningsea from 10-11:30.

We have Play-doh, a toy kitchen and food, toy farm animals, cars and garages, Duplo, puzzles, books and drawing materials as well as baby friendly toys along with support cushions for the really tiny ones. If the weather is nice the children have the opportunity to play outside with outdoor toys.

For adults there is a hot drink and biscuit and a chance for a chat whilst the little ones play.

A snack and drink is given to the children half way through the session which is included in the cost of the attendance. This cost is  $\pounds 2$  per session, per family. However, if you pay for four sessions at once it's  $\pounds 6$  ( $\pounds 1.50$  per session).

Adults without children are also welcome if you fancy a hot drink and a chat (amongst the noise of the children playing), a £1 donation is asked for in this instance.

We look forward to welcoming you to the group!

There is plenty of parking available outside the village hall.

#### Bell Ringers at the church

Bellringing practice in Horningsea is on the second and last Friday of each month from 19:00 to 20.30. Do come along and find out about learning how to ring. There is no age limit! You don't need to be musical and many Bell Ringers are not members of a church congregation.
