Horningsea Horticultural Show

If you have never entered the Show before, now is the time to give it a go. The atmosphere is very friendly and there are many different classes to choose from. You don't have to be a gardener to enter!

The Show will be held on Saturday 13th July in the Village Hall. Schedules and entry forms will be delivered to every house in the village in early June, so there will be plenty of time to plan exhibits. The flower arrangement theme this year is "Moon Landing" and the theme for the photos is "What makes you smile?".

Entry forms need to be delivered to Vee Saunders by Wednesday 10thJuly, late entries may be acepted, at the discretion of the committee, up until 9pm on Friday 12thJuly. Exhibits can be staged in the Village Hall on Friday 12thJuly between 7 and 9pm or between 8 and 10.30 am on Saturday morning. Viewing in the afternoon starts at 2.30pm. As usual donated produce will be auctioned and there will be a raffle after the prize giving.

At the AGM in May John Rooke said he would like to stand down as chair at some point in the year. He was thanked for his wise leadership over many years. The Friends are therefore looking for a new chairman: ideally someone who does not have any other responsibility for the church but who believes the church needs to be maintained and cherished as an important part of the village heritage. The Churchyard

A formal request has been made to create about 30 new grave spaces in the churchyard. Notices about the final consultation have been attached to the church gates. It is hoped we will be given permission as there is only one grave space left. Once that is used the churchyard would be declared "closed" and responsibility would

pass to the Parish Council. The PC hope this will not happen as the cost of maintenance would also pass to the PC. The Church Council will ensure everyone is kept informed as and when permission is granted.

Memorial Tree - Edward Maunder

The HRA have recently replaced the old dead tree by the bus shelter.





The original tree was planted in Edward Maunder's memory by his family. Edward lived with his family in Horningsea but was tragically killed in a traffic accident in the Village when he was only 12 years old. His family moved out of the village some years ago.

The tree is a Prunus Autumnalis (Autumn cherry) which flowers from November to April so will add some colour to the Village over the winter.

Thanks to Bill Parker for making a new memorial plaque and for the HRA for buying, planting and watering the new tree.

Horningsea Adults & Toddlers - HATs

Horningsea adult and toddler group meets on Tuesday morning in the village hall in Horningsea from 10-11:30.

We have Play-doh, a toy kitchen and food, toy farm animals, cars and garages, Duplo, puzzles, books and drawing materials as well as baby friendly toys along with support cushions for the really tiny ones. If the weather is nice the children have the opportunity to play outside with outdoor toys.

For adults there is a hot drink and biscuit and a chance for a chat whilst the little ones play.

A snack and drink is given to the children half way through the session which is included in the cost of the attendance. This cost is £2 per session, per family. However, if you pay for four sessions at once it's £6 (£1.50 per session).

Adults without children are also welcome if you fancy a hot drink and a chat (amongst the noise of the children playing), a £1 donation is asked for in this instance.

We look forward to welcoming you to the group!
