Symptoms of coronavirus

- a cough
- a high temperature
- shortness of breath

But these symptoms do not necessarily mean you have the illness. The symptoms are similar to other illnesses that are much more common, such as cold and flu.

How to avoid catching or spreading coronavirus

- Wash your hands with soap and water **often** do this for at least 20 seconds
- Always wash your hands when you get home or into work
- Use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available
- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze
- Put used tissues in the bin straight away and wash your hands afterwards
- Try to avoid close contact with people who are unwell

• do not touch your eyes, nose or mouth if your hands are not clean

Lenten Concert - New Cambridge Singers

Saturday 28th March, 19:30, St. Mary's Church, Fen Ditton

New Cambridge Singers, one of Cambridge's leading chamber choirs, will be presenting two contrasting masterpieces for their Lenten concert in St Mary's, Fen Ditton.

Swiss composer Frank Martin's epic Mass for Double Choir is one of the pinnacles of the choral repertoire: soulful, energetic, rhythmic and achingly powerful by turns. Written in the 1920s, he kept the manuscript in a drawer for some forty years, until being persuaded by friends to release it, because, as he said, "I did not want it to be performed...I considered it as being a matter between God and myself."

Pergolesi's famous Stabat Mater, a moving and profoundly human picture of a grieving mother composed in the final weeks of Pergolesi's life, will be performed in its version for full choir, accompanied by strings and organ.

VE Day weekend in Horningsea - Make, Do and Mend!

Friday 8th May and Sunday 10th May

In the War it was important that everyone knew how to sew, knit, cook their rations into healthy meals and mend any household item that was broken. A different world from those brought up in the age of disposable goods, Amazon and eBay. For VE Day we will revive the Make, Do and Mend culture, coached by volunteers from Circular Cambridge("Living well with less stuff"). Their "Repair Cafes" have skilled repairers who can mend a DVD player, put a new zip in a pair of trousers, darn a favourite jumper or sew an arm back on a teddy bear. We will have Grandmother's sewing machine, knitting and crochet needles, wool & scraps of material.

If you are good at making, creating, mending or repairing, or if you would like to sit & learn with a trained repairer, let us know. If you have stuff that needs mending, keep your eyes on the publicity. You may need to let us know in advance before bringing the items along to the church on 8 May. We thought it would also be fun to set a Ration Book Challenge ... can you feed yourself and your family for a week on the Wartime rations? The Rations will be set out in the May Herald and Village Facebook so you can "take the Challenge" in the first week of May!

During the afternoon of 8 May the HRA will be organising a "street party" in the churchyard so we can join the national celebrations at 3pm. At 7pm the Church bells will ring in conjunction with the National bell ringing.

There is a plan for a disco/ barbeque or "bop" in the evening. Watch this space!

On Sunday 10th May, the afternoon VE Day Service at Horningsea will be an opportunity to give thanks for the restoration of the stained glass window in the North Aisle. The repair was paid for by the Friends from money raised from the Open Gardens day, and by a legacy from the late Mary Clark, whose father is commemorated in the window. Frederick Bailey was the officer responsible for gathering horses from the village to send to WWI (just as in the book/film/play Warhorse). Mary's brother Thomas was killed in Burma in WWII. The Baileys lived at Clayhithe Farm.

During the Service excerpts from Molly Marshall's wartime diaries will be read, taking us back to how she felt as an enemy alien in Finland from 1939 until she was repatriated to the UK in 1944. Molly moved to Horningsea the next year and lived here until shortly before her death 7 years ago.

Horningsea Adults & Toddlers - HATs

Horningsea Adults and Toddlers group meets on Tuesday morning in the village hall in Horningsea from 10-11:30.

We have Play-doh, a toy kitchen and food, toy farm animals, cars and garages, Duplo, puzzles, books and drawing materials as well as baby friendly toys along with support cushions for the really tiny ones. If the weather is nice the children have the opportunity to play outside with outdoor toys.

For adults there is a hot drink and a biscuit and a chance for a chat whilst the little ones play.

A snack and drink is given to the children half way through the session which is included in the cost of attendance. This cost is £2 per session, per family. However, if you pay for four sessions at once it's £6 (£1.50 per session).

Adults without children are also welcome if you fancy a hot drink and a chat (amongst the noise of the children playing), a £1 donation is asked for in this instance. We look forward to welcoming you to the group!

There is plenty of parking available outside the village hall.
