Choral Concert in Fen Ditton

Sunday 20th March, 19:30, Fen Ditton

On Sunday 20th March, 7:30 pm, New Cambridge Singers, one of Cambridge's leading chamber choirs, will be presenting two contrasting masterpieces for their Lenten concert in St Mary's, Fen Ditton.

Swiss composer Frank Martin's epic Mass for Double Choir is one of the greatest choral works of the twentieth century, soulful, energetic, rhythmic and achingly powerful by turns. Written in the 1920s, Martin kept the manuscript in a drawer for some forty years because, as he said, "I did not want it to be performed...I considered it as being a matter between God and myself. I felt then that an expression of religious feeling should remain secret and removed from public opinion."

He perhaps also felt that his efforts would seem presumptuous beside the genius of Bach, whose St Matthew Passion he had heard as a ten year old. This had affected him profoundly and set him on the path as a musician.

He was eventually persuaded by friends to release the Mass, which was published and performed for the first time in 1963

Pergolesi's famous Stabat Mater is a moving and profoundly human picture of a grieving mother. It was composed in the final weeks of his life, before his death from tuberculosis at the age of twenty six. It will be performed for women's voices, accompanied by organ.

Sewage works Consultation - Last chance to tell them what you think!

Anglian Water's Phase 3 Consultation is now underway. This is your FINAL opportunity to have your say about traffic access, design, odour, carbon cost, four years of construction traffic and other issues. The consultation runs from the 24th February to the 27th April. All residents will have the chance to comment and ALL comments will go to the Planning Inspectors. It is a real chance to get over our objections and, if the application is agreed, to lessen the effects on our communities. This is also the final consultation before Anglian Water submit their Development Consent Order application to the Planning Inspectorate.

- ☐ Undertake any actions delegated to them from meetings.
- ☐ Receive and respond to PC emails in between meetings.

CAN YOU BE CO-OPTED OR ELECTED AS A COUNCILLOR?

You must be:

a British Citizen of the Commonwealth or the European Union;
Be 18 years of age or over
during that 12-month period resided in the council area; or
Have during the whole of the 12 months preceding that day occupied as owner or
tenant any land or other premises in the council area; or
have during that same period had your principal or only place of work in the council
area; or
You can also satisfy the criteria to be elected if you have lived in the council area or within 3 miles of it for the whole of the 12 months preceding the "relevant day".

You cannot stand as a Parish Councillor if you:

- are subject of a bankruptcy restriction order or interim order
- have, within five years before the day of the election/co-option, been convicted in the United Kingdom of any offence and have had a sentence of imprisonment (whether suspended or not) for a period of over three months without the option of a fine
- Work for the council you want to become a councillor for (but you can work for other local authorities, including the principal authorities that represent the same area).

Treasurers needed

New Life and Horningsea PCC are both looking for new treasurers. If you have any background in bookkeeping or finance, would you think about taking on one of these roles?

New Life is straightforward, paying two cheques monthly for the copier & printing costs. Subs generally go directly into the bank, with only a few cheques to be paid in. Then just record the income and outgoings.

The PCCs accounts are more extensive. Income and expenditure is mostly by direct debit and credit, with a few costs paid via online banking. The treasurer presents a financial summary to the PCC up to four times a year, as well as preparing year end accounts for the Annual Meeting (APCM).
