### ***Music courses for children during the holidays***

#### **Cambridgeshire Holiday Orchestra**

Founded in 1953, Cambridgeshire Holiday Orchestra is a Cambridge institution, running high quality music opportunities for children between the ages of 7 and 18 in a friendly and relaxed atmosphere where everybody is welcome, usually held at West Road Concert Hall. There are ensembles and groups for children who play an orchestral instrument at any standard, but also plenty of sessions for children with no previous musical experience. These include string and band (wind instruments and percussion)

ensembles at different levels, full symphonic orchestras, as well as Jazz and other sessions for the children that play instruments already. In addition there are things such as choirs, percussion, African drumming, Ukulele, Folk, Gamelan and more on offer, which are suitable for everyone. Cambridgeshire Holiday Orchestra runs three courses, one each during the main school holidays (Easter, summer and Christmas). The next course is from the 4th to the 7th of April, with still some remaining places to book. As a new venture this Easter there will also be sessions for the whole family to enjoy, including a family sing, percussion workshop and folk workshop. Also new this Easter is an afternoon recorder ensemble and an Easter orchestra aimed at less experienced players to give them a taste of playing in a full orchestra. Orchestral instrument or recorder playing parents can join in with their sessions on the last day. All promises to be a lot of fun and an exciting opportunity to get out and meet old and new friends. ### ***Sewage works Consultation - Last chance to Have Your Say***

Anglian Water's Phase 3 Consultation is now underway. This is your FINAL opportunity to have your say about traffic access, design, odour, carbon cost, four years of construction traffic and other issues. The consultation runs from the 24th February to the 27th April.

### ***Tree Planting for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee***

St. Peter's church has planted three fruiting and flowering native cherries and plums in the hedgerow and one larger flowering cherry. They border onto the Crown and Punchbowl patio and car park. They were dedicated at the end of the Mothering Sunday service.

Also, after the service everyone took home a plant pot with a sunflower seed (thanks to Sophie Kitt for planting them!). The sunflower is the symbol of Ukraine so we hope that watching the sunflowers grow we will hold the people of Ukraine in our minds. It's not too late to plant your own ... perhaps by harvest time we can have photographs of how tall they have grown, and perhaps by then we can all be thinking about the rebuilding of the towns and cities destroyed by the war.

## **Notes**

### ***Horningsea Broadband outage***

As of the Herald publication date the latest Estimated Repair Date (ERD) is 14th April, 2022.

The delays appear to be because the conduit under the road has collapsed and damaged the fibre optic cables. It will need traffic lights and digging up and replacing.

You may be entitled to compensation. Contact your ISP (the company you pay money to for broadband) to ask about it.
