# Jubilee celebrations in Horningsea

#### Thursday 2nd June to Sunday 5th June.

After a long two years it seems like we will finally be able to enjoy this summer and what better way to do this than with a four day Jubilee weekend.

Horningsea Residents Association along with the Church are organising events from Thursday 2nd June right through to Sunday 5th to celebrate a unique milestone in our history, Her Majesty The Queen's 70th year as our Monarch and Head of the Commonwealth.

#### **Thursday**

**21:00** - We will kick off the Jubilee weekend on Laney Meadows (behind the playground) with music and a glass of fizz from 21:00 to watch our Beacon being lit. The Principle Beacon will be lit at 21.15 and our beacon, along with thousands of beacons around the country and 54 Beacons from the Commonwealth Countries, will be lit at 21.45.

#### **Friday**

There's a full day of activities at the church.

**11:00** - The Bell Ringers will be taking part in the National Ringing for the Jubilee. The Church will be open with an exhibition of photos and Royal memorabilia. Stay for tea and cakes in the afternoon.

**19.00** - Join in the Village Concert in the church. So far we have a Horningsea Orchestra rehearsing Juba Dance, some string players, a Ukrainian folk song, Madrigals, recorder ... readings from Alan Bennet, from The Remains of the Day, A A Milne, Jane Austen, Just William, Dylan Thomas, and more!

#### Saturday

**Evening** - We will be showing The Queen's Platinum Party at the Palace on a big screen on John and Liz Harrison's field. The BBQ will be lit and The Plough and Fleece and the Crown and Punchbowl will very generously be providing us with beer and sausages. The fabulous horse box bar The Copper Tree will be serving Gin and Prosecco. Look forward to a fun evening with Ed Sheeran leading the musical tribute, he'll be on the screen not in John's field! # IT'S CRAP by the Save Honey Hill Community Choir

The Save Honey Hill Community Choir from Horningsea, Fen Ditton and other villages released its comedy protest song IT'S CRAP. We are protesting against the unnecessary relocation of Cambridge's sewage works to Honey Hill, a beautiful, unspoilt site in Cambridge's Green Belt. The climate impact of demolishing one functioning sewage plant and building another, just 1.5 km away will be enormous.

The song is written by local resident Liz Cotton and was recorded in the village church. The music video is part of the Save Honey Hill campaign. Anglian Water will be submitting its application later this year to the government's Planning Inspectorate.

# Volunteers required for Crimestoppers committee

By way of introduction, my name is Colin Dobbins, and I have recently become the newly appointed volunteer chair for Crimestoppers in Cambridgeshire.

As you may know, Crimestoppers is an independent charity that gives people in communities across the UK the power to speak up and stop crime, 100% anonymously. We receive over 1,000 reports of criminal activities from the public every day, both through our freephone 0800 555111, or via our online reporting form. Please do visit www.crimestoppers-uk.org to see further information about the charity.

After a number of years without a volunteer committee in the Cambridgeshire region, I have been appointed to recruit and manage a new committee to help promote Crimestoppers throughout Cambridgeshire.

Crimestoppers committees largely focus their time and resources into supporting their local authorities, law enforcement and other charities & organisations which an interest in community safety and reducing crime in communities.

As a starting point, I have divided Cambridgeshire into the below various districts:

- Peterborough
- Fenland
- East Cambs
- Cambs City
- South Cambs
- Huntingdonshire

My hope is to secure volunteer/s from each of these districts to form representation on the committee, this will ensure that Crimestoppers is engaging and supportive of all local crime concerns across Cambridgeshire.

Being a part of this committee will not be exhaustive and should sit alongside your current activity relatively seamlessly.

If you have the time to support this newly formed committee and help promote Crimestoppers or have some ideas of who else may be able to, I would be very grateful to hear back from you.
