Horningsea Church celebrates Creationtide

Sunday 18th September 14.00-16.00, In the churchyard and in the church

The Friends of Horningsea Church have organised an afternoon to explore and celebrate the biodiversity of the churchyard ... and the village

There will be an opportunity to discover the number and variety of moths that fly around the village in the evenings; a chance to see what insects are feeding in the hedgerows; an opportunity to look for varieties of bees; a chance to build a bug hotel to ensure the insects can survive the winter. We can also see a video of the swifts nests and the hatching of the baby swifts filmed in the village. There will be an exhibition of wildlife photographs taken in the village ... there may be reports on ants, bats, owls and bee boxes. Botanists can contribute by looking at the plants in the hedgerow and amongst the grasses ... can you find the "fiddle dock?".

The Friends hope you will come and join in... we can't promise David Attenborough but we will have a number of other experts on hand to talk about what they have found.

Tea and cakes will be on offer all afternoon!

Save Honey Hill group needs funds for legal advice to stop the Sewage Works relocation

Right under our noses, a Crime against our environment is taking place. Anglian Water is preparing an application to move a fully-functioning sewage works less than a mile to a new location on arable farmland in the Green Belt at Honey Hill between the villages of Fen Ditton, Horningsea and Quy. They are doing this with £227 million of public money too. Save Honey Hill will challenge this application and need legal advice in its preparation and legal representation. Wimpole Estate: free admission to local community groups

Wimpole Estate, a National Trust property in Cambridgeshire have recently launched a new initiative where they are offering local community groups free admission to the estate and its facilities. This is a fantastic opportunity to encourage creativity and connection with nature.

Polly Ingham-Watts, the General Manager of Wimpole Hall, is passionate that everyone can enjoy all that Wimpole has to offer and recognises that National Trust membership or the standard admission charges are not accessible to everyone. Each pass issued under this initiative would provide free access for up to 16 people.

Passes may be used on any day except on bank holidays and the weekends preceding bank holidays. Those intending to use the pass are asked to email wimpolehall@nationaltrust.org.uk or call the estate before coming, stating the name of your group, the number of people and approximate time of arrival. Where practical community groups are encouraged to visit during weekdays as Wimpole can get very busy at weekends when there may be less scope to cater for additional needs.
