

# UPDATE: Anglian Water has submitted their DCO application for the relocation of the Cambridge Sewage Works

Unfortunately the day we have all been dreading, but preparing for, is here. Anglian Water put in their application on the 31st January. The Planning Inspectorate has 28 days to accept or reject this. Then the really hard work starts!

Now the application has been submitted here are the likely dates of the DCO Application and Examinations programme.
