Save Honey Hill Update on SHH Relevant Representation to Planning Inspectorate

Save Honey Hill Group registered as an Interested Party (IP) and sent our Representation to the Planning Inspectorate on Tuesday 18th July, which you can read on the Save Honey Hill website:

The Planning Inspectorate will inform all IPs of the timetable for the next stage - the Examination, which is likely to start in September. At that stage anyone who has registered

as an Interested Party will be invited to make further comments in a Written Representation. We expect our barristers to give more input into that Representation.

During the Examination stage, which usually lasts six months, the Planning Inspectors will send questions to Anglian Water and to stakeholders for further information raised by the Representations. They will also hold issue-specific hearings. We will keep you updated when we have more detail. There is more information on the NI website

Horningsea Parish Council are looking for new Councillors

Horningsea Parish Councillors:

- Are available for PC meetings, held approximately 6 times a year after 7pm in the evenings.
- Attend the odd training sessions
- Undertake any actions delegated to them from meetings.
- Receive and respond to PC emails in between meetings.

CAN YOU BE CO-OPTED OR ELECTED AS A COUNCILLOR?

You must be:

- British Citizen of the Commonwealth or the European Union;
- Be 18 years of age or over
- during that 12-month period resided in the council area; or
- Have during the whole of the 12 months preceding that day occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in the council area; or
- have during that same period had your principal or only place of work in the council area; or
- You can also satisfy the criteria to be elected if you have lived in the council area or within 3 miles of it for the whole of the 12 months preceding the "relevant day".

You cannot stand as a Parish Councillor if you:

- are subject of a bankruptcy restriction order or interim order
- have, within five years before the day of the election/co-option, been convicted in the United Kingdom of any offence and have had a sentence of imprisonment (whether suspended or not) for a period of over three months without the option of a fine
- Work for the council you want to become a councillor for (but you can work for other local authorities, including the principal authorities that represent the same area).

You must submit by the 2nd or 4th weekend of the month, the Herald being published before the first and third weekends of the month. Submission of any news items implies consent to any editing and the editorial team's decision is always final. **Always send as plain text via email**. Do NOT send formatted documents. Do NOT send articles as PDF or Word files. Stay under 700 words, preferably less. Attach any photos to the email. If you send in a PDF or image of a poster/flyer then attach a paragraph of text to go into the Herald as well.
