# 2024 Local Highways Improvement Bids and Horningsea Greenways update

As some of you may know the Parish Council applies annually for Local Highways Improvements (LHI) funding. LHI's are delivered by the County Council on a joint-funded basis and applicants can apply for funding of up to either £25,000 for complex projects or £10,000 for non-complex projects, as a contribution to their scheme. The PC is expected to provide a minimum contribution of 10% towards the total scheme cost.

The applications need to be submitted by the 12th of January so time is limited for the applications to be written.

In previous years we have been successful in obtaining funding for the 40mph buffer zone at each end of the village as well as the NVAS unit (the mobile flashing speed sign).

It is key to add that the applications are scored and priorities on a matrix-style system therefore it's important to obtain village support! As part of this process, I have included a poll which I would be grateful if you could use.

We are looking to put forward two applications one via the PC and the other via the RHA. The proposed applications will be:

#### 1. Application one

Given the greenway works that are ongoing and very much focusing on the south end of the village, the PC is keen to address the north end of the village. Given the LHI funding availability, we cannot simply apply for the works as for example to continue the footpath to the end of the village would cost £30,000.

As such as a first step, the proposed application will be to employ the Highways design team to fully design a scheme to include the below. The PC will continue to work with the Local Authorities to obtain funding for its implication (maybe in phases) via government funds or 106 monies, but either way, we need the scheme designed first.

- Continuation of the footpath to link into the field gate just beyond the village gates
- Road improvements to slow vehicles as they enter the village, with the construction of an Island or similar
- Road calming measures between Gayton Farm and Manor Farm

- Road calming measures between Clayhithe and Horningsea

The cost for this design work is £6,000

#### 2. Application two

To apply for a second NVAS unit. We have seen at least a 10% reduction in speeding with the current NVAS unit, so we are looking at having one at each end of the village.

The existing unit, although working, has stopped collecting data which would be very helpful to the PC in any other similar applications.

The cost for the NVAS unit is £5,750

#### 3. Horningsea Greenways Update

The Parish Council have raised all the feedback from residents with the Greater Cambridge Partnership (GCP) and have a meeting in the diary with the GCP and their design team on the 12th January. Updates will be put out in the village Horningsea Residents Facebook group and in February's Herald.

# Save Honey Hill update - Are you an "Affected Person"?

The <u>agenda</u> for the Compulsory Acquisition Hearing on Tuesday, 9th January has been published on the <u>National Infrastructure Planning Website (CAH 9 Jan Agenda)</u>.

It is worth checking because some residents in Horningsea, Fen Ditton and Waterbeach are included as "Affected Persons".

- <u>Book of reference</u> this is land which is proposed to be subject to Powers of compulsory acquisition, Rights to use the land or Rights to carry out protective work. As an example, this could be temporary possession of a footpath.
- Compulsory acquisition schedule (Permanent or temporary) this refers to the plot numbers in the Book of References and the current state of any negotiation <u>CA schedule</u>
- Land Plans show the plots of land by number.

All three documents are searchable.

The <u>agenda</u> was only just published so you can still ask to attend the hearing, either in person or virtually, by phoning 0303 444 3201 or emailing CambridgeWWTPR@planninginspectorate.gov.uk.
