

# HRA INTERNATIONAL NIGHT

## Horningsea Planning

### *Save Honey Hill update*

Following the end of the DCO Examination Period on the 17th April, 2024, the Planning Inspectors submitted their report to Steve Reed OBE, the new Secretary of State for Department of Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (DEFRA). DEFRA then had three months in which to make a decision (12th October 2024). However, just before the deadline expired, a postponement until 12th January 2025 was announced.

On 13th January (the 12th was a Sunday), the decision was postponed again! In a statement to the House of Commons Steve Reed stated that the decision must take into account the recently published National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) which had been revised by the new government and formalised on the 12th December 2024.

### **The new deadline is now set for 14th April 2025.**

The delay was disappointing given the hard work of the Save Honey Hill team over the past four and a half years. However, Save Honey Hill Group are pleased the Secretary of State is considering his decision so carefully and will be happy to answer any questions from him and, indeed, invite him to visit the proposed site and see the contribution it makes to the purposes of the Green Belt, i.e. the openness of the countryside, the contribution to agriculture and the impact the proposed sewage works relocation would have on the setting of the historic city of Cambridge.

SHH hopes this will give him sufficient time to recognise that the relocation is unnecessary as Cambridge is able to meet its housing target without building on the vacated site. The group has shown that even the new method of calculating housing need as set out in the new National Planning Policy Framework, can be met by both the adopted 2018 and the emerging Local Plans for Cambridge and South Cambridgeshire.

On 20th January, the Secretary of State invited comments from Interested Parties and Save Honey Hill submitted their response before the deadline of the 3rd February 2025.

## ***Building work at the Church***

Plans are afoot to repair the floor in the north side of the church and to make the access to the church tower safe. It is a slow process getting the architects specifications, a Faculty (permission from the Diocese) and then find the money to pay for the work. The church council will be applying for grants but may also be asking for help in fundraising. Offers of help will be happily received!

## ***NHS Winter Vaccinations***

NHS Cambridgeshire & Peterborough is urging anyone eligible for their COVID-19, flu, RSV or pneumococcal vaccines to make sure they've had them this winter. Please check

if you, or someone you care for, is eligible - each vaccine has a slightly different eligibility criteria as follows:

- Flu vaccine -- for anyone aged 65 or over (including those who will be 65 by 31 March 2025); have certain long-term health conditions; are pregnant; live in a care home; are the main carer for an older or disabled person, or receive a carer's allowance; or live with someone who has a weakened immune system.
- COVID-19 vaccine -- for anyone aged 65+; those aged between six months and 64 years who are at increased risk of getting seriously ill due to a health condition or treatment; people who live in a care home for older adults, and those who are pregnant; and frontline health and care workers.
- RSV vaccine -- for anyone who is pregnant, or aged 75-79.
- Pneumococcal vaccine -- for anyone 65 or over (only one dose is needed).

*A number of issues, not the least of which is the complexity of the project, mean that we have not yet been able to finalise the contract with the principal contractor. This is delaying the start of works despite the contractor being otherwise ready to begin, but at this stage the expected date of completion remains May/June 2025.*
